Question 1: At the Municipal Court level, the only court many citizens experience, the greatest obstacles to justice are the size of dockets and the crush of people accessing the system simultaneously. From my experience as magistrate and bailiff for 23 years, the only reasonable remedy is to deal with each case efficiently. If that happens, dockets work out quickly enough so there is sufficient time to devote attention to serious or complex cases. If not, the system bogs down. Efficiency must be balanced with the need to let people know their own issue is valued. Both can be accomplished, with effort.

Question 2: No. Tough economic times deplete resources. If the economy brightens, so will the picture for legal access. If it darkens, access to some extent depends on the efforts of lawyers to offer voluntary or reduced –cost help, as many already do.

The Columbus Bar Association and its membership also fill in gaps. As a court, the Municipal Court has an ongoing volunteer mediation program which creates access. The court also has an appointed counsel list that assures legal assistance to many. These programs help. They don't remedy a problem which can be identified readily but is difficult to solve.

LEAGUE EXPLANATION

Franklin County Children
Services (FCCS) is the agency
mandated by law to protect and
care for the county's abused, ne-
glected, and dependent children;
the agency also serves troubled
youth. About two-thirds of the
agency's operations are funded by

two property tax levies, a 3.15 mill
levy and a 1.90 mill levy. The 3.15
mill levy expires at the end of this
year, while the other levy expires
in 2014. A replacement levy of
3.10 mills will appear on the
November 3 ballot. FCCS intends
to propose an increase in its other
levy in 2014, from 1.90 to 2.50. If
successful, the two levies together
will account for roughly 72 per-
cent of total projected revenue for
FCCS over the next decade.

The levy being replaced this year
currently collects \$69 million in
annual revenue for the agency.
If passed, the 3.10 mill replace-
ment-with-reduction levy will
collect \$93.5 million in annual
revenue. Currently, the owner of
a \$100,000 market value home in
Franklin County pays \$116.99 a
year in property taxes to support
FCCS. Passage of a 3.10 mill
replacement-with-reduction levy
will increase this tax by \$28.48 a
year to \$145.47 beginning in 2010.
The increase results from the fact
that, by state law, the current levy
is being collected at a rate lower
than 3.15 mills – 2.17 mills, called
the effective rate – so that total
revenue does not exceed that
collected when the levy was first
passed 10 years ago.

The agency's expenditures in 2008
totaled \$167 million. The biggest
single category of expenditures,
amounting to almost 70 percent
of the budget, is payments to
contracted service providers with
which the agency partners to
provide foster, residential, and
managed care services to families
and children. Personnel costs for
the agency's 740 staff members
account for just under 30 percent
of the budget.

**ARGUMENTS MADE IN
SUPPORT OF ISSUE 4**

- Franklin County Children
Services depends heavily on this
levy. If it is not replaced, the
agency will lose \$69 million in
revenue – almost half its budget.
- Given recent state funding cuts
to social service organizations
caused by the economic downturn
– more than \$1 million – Children
Services relies even more on local
property taxes to fulfill its mission
to protect children.

- The agency is accredited by the Council on Accreditation of Services for Families and Children, one of only a few county children services boards in Ohio and the nation to meet the rigorous national standards regarding quality of services and sound management practice and to be so accredited.

ARGUMENTS MADE IN OPPOSITION TO ISSUE 4

- Revenue from this levy will jump significantly, from just under \$70 million annually to more than \$93 million, even though the agency anticipates a decline in service demand over the next decade.

- The agency took 10 years – from 1999 to 2008 – to respond to a recommendation to hold contract service providers more accountable for their work and the funds they expend.

- While the “replacement levy with reduction” appears to lower the millage rate, the decrease is only from 3.15 to 3.10, and in fact, homeowners will actually pay more because the current levy is being collected at the effective rate of only 2.17 mills; moreover, the agency intends to propose an increase in its other levy in 2014, from 1.90 to 2.50.

STATE BALLOT ISSUES

ISSUE 1: PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE TO ISSUE BONDS TO PROVIDE COMPENSATION TO VETERANS OF THE PERSIAN GULF, AFGHANISTAN, AND IRAQ CONFLICTS

(Proposed by Joint Resolution of the General Assembly of Ohio)

To adopt Section 2r of Article VIII of the Constitution of the State of Ohio

A YES vote means approval of the amendment.

A NO vote means disapproval of the amendment.

A majority YES vote is required for the amendment to be adopted. If approved, this proposed amendment shall take effect immediately.

LEAGUE EXPLANATION OF ISSUE 1:

This ballot issue proposes a constitutional amendment that would provide compensation to veterans serving during the Persian Gulf, Afghanistan, and Iraq conflicts. The amendment is similar to the bond issues passed by the voters to compensate veterans of World War I, World War II, the Korean War, and the Vietnam conflict. It will provide the state with the authority to issue up to \$200 million of bonds. The Ohio treasurer has estimated that only \$106 million of the bond proceeds might actually be needed. All bonds must be issued by December 31, 2013. Repayment of these bonds would be a general obligation of the state backed by the taxing power of the state. Revenue from these bonds would be used to provide additional compensation as follows:

- Payment may be made to Ohio residents who have served on active duty in the United States armed forces between August 2, 1990 and March 3, 1991, which was the duration of the Persian Gulf conflict; between October 7, 2001 and the end of the United States’ involvement in Afghanistan; and between March 19, 2003 and the end of the United States’ involvement in Iraq.

- Veterans who served domestically or in foreign service in locations other than the Persian Gulf, Afghanistan, or Iraq may receive \$50 for each month served up to a maximum of \$500.

- Veterans who served in the Persian Gulf, Afghanistan, or Iraq may receive \$100 for each month served up to a maximum of \$1000, or may receive \$1000 if medically discharged due to combat-related disabilities.

- If a person died as a result of injuries sustained in Persian Gulf, Afghanistan, or Iraq service, that person’s family may receive \$5000.

- If a person is missing in action or held in enemy captivity, that person’s family may receive \$5000. The Legislative Services Commission estimates that issuing \$200 million of obligations could increase the state’s annual debt service expense by up to \$18 million. The voters must approve this

bonding authority because the Ohio constitution does not permit an appropriation being made for a period longer than two years.

PROponents OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT ARGUE THAT:

1. Passing the amendment by vote of the people shows that Ohioans appreciate Ohio veterans.
2. The payments will ease veterans’ transition back into civilian life.

OPponents OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT ARGUE THAT:

1. Tax monies will be diverted to paying principle and interest, and this may limit the availability of state revenue for other state programs during a period of financial crisis.
2. Future taxpayers will be responsible for the debt incurred for these payments. The payments should be paid for by revenues available in the current biennium.

ISSUE 2: PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO CREATE THE OHIO LIVESTOCK CARE STANDARDS BOARD

(Proposed by Joint Resolution of the General Assembly of Ohio)

To enact Section 1 of Article XIV of the Ohio Constitution

A YES vote means approval of the amendment.

A NO vote means disapproval of the amendment.

A majority YES vote is required for the amendment to be adopted.

If approved, this proposed amendment will be effective immediately.

LEAGUE EXPLANATION OF ISSUE 2:

- This proposed constitutional amendment would create the Ohio Livestock Care Standards Board for the purpose of establishing standards governing the care and well-being of livestock and poultry in Ohio.

- The bipartisan board would consist of thirteen members:
 - o The director of the state department that regulates agriculture
 - o Ten members appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate, including:

- One member representing family farms

- One member knowledgeable about food safety

- Two members representing statewide organizations that represent farmers

- One member who is a veterinarian

- The State Veterinarian in the state department that regulates agriculture

- The dean of the agriculture department of a college or university in Ohio

- Two members of the public representing Ohio consumers

- One member representing a county humane society

- o One member appointed by the Speaker of the House who shall be a family farmer

- o One member appointed by the President of the Senate who shall be a family farmer

- The Board would have authority to establish standards governing the care and well-being of livestock and poultry in Ohio, subject only to the authority of the General Assembly.

PROponents OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT ARGUE THAT:

1. The board represents a balance of interests.
2. The board would establish standards governing the care and well being of livestock and poultry in Ohio.
3. Ohioans can have greater confidence in the safety of locally produced food.

OPponents OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT ARGUE THAT:

1. The board should be created by statute rather than by amendment to the Ohio Constitution.

2. Creating another regulatory board utilizes revenues best spent on basic services to Ohioans.

3. The amendment could prevent certain animal care reform proposed by national animal rights organizations.

ISSUE 3: PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO AUTHORIZE A CASINO IN CLEVELAND, COLUMBUS, CINCINNATI, AND TOLEDO, OHIO

(Proposed by Initiative Petition)

To add a new Section 6a to Article XV of the Ohio Constitution

A YES vote means approval of the amendment.

A NO vote means disapproval of the amendment.

A majority YES vote is required for the amendment to be adopted.

If approved, the proposed amendment will take effect 30 days after the election.

LEAGUE EXPLANATION OF ISSUE 3:

This amendment would authorize four casinos, one each in Cincinnati, Cleveland, Columbus, and Toledo, located on particular parcels of land owned by private individuals.

1. The operator would be required to pay a tax of 33% annually on gross casino receipts. “Gross casino receipts” excludes payments to winners. The tax revenue would be allocated in the following ways:

- 51% to the 88 counties on a pro rata basis, with 50% of the county’s distribution going to the county’s most populated city if it had a population of greater than 80,000 as of the 2000 United States census.

- 34% to public school districts in proportion to their public school district populations.

- 5% to the host city where the casino that generated the revenue is located.

- 3% to fund the Ohio Casino Control Commission.

- 3% to a fund supporting purses, breeding programs and operations at existing horse racetracks.

- 2% to fund a state law enforcement training program.

- 2% to fund treatment of problem gambling and substance abuse.

2. The Ohio Casino Control Commission would license and regulate casino operators, management companies, key employees and all gaming. The commission would have 7 members appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate.

3. Each casino operator must make a minimum initial investment of \$250 million.

4. The initial license fee of \$50 million for each casino will fund state economic development programs.

5. Each casino could operate 24 hours a day. Each casino may have a maximum of 5000 slot machines. Each casino may conduct any type of card or table games, slot machines or electronic

gaming devices permitted by states adjacent to Ohio, except bingo, and horse racing where the pari-mutuel system of wagering is conducted.

PROponents OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT ARGUE THAT:

1. Thirty-eight states—including Kentucky, Indiana, Michigan, and Pennsylvania—have casino gambling.

2. By authorizing casinos in Ohio, the profits could benefit our state rather than other states.

3. Counties, public school districts, and many cities will receive tax revenue generated by the casinos, and each can decide how to best spend its money.

4. The casinos will create 34,000 new jobs in Cincinnati, Cleveland, Columbus, and Toledo.

5. The casinos will stimulate the economy by adding restaurants, hotels and ancillary businesses.

OPponents OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT ARGUE THAT:

1. The Ohio general revenue fund, which supports basic services for Ohioans, will get \$0 from the gross casino receipts tax.

2. Ohio lottery profits, currently dedicated to education, may decrease because people will gamble at the casinos instead of playing the lottery.

3. Ohioans may spend money at the casinos they would have spent at other existing Ohio businesses such as restaurants, movies, or sports events, adversely impacting those businesses.

4. The number of gambling addicts in Ohio would increase, and the tax receipts dedicated to providing treatment for addicts could be insufficient.

5. The proposed amendment could be construed to mean that all games allowed at the casinos can be played only at the casinos, eliminating church-festival poker games and casino nights sponsored by charitable groups.

THINGS TO REMEMBER ON ELECTION DAY

VOTER IDENTIFICATION

All voters must have identification with them when they vote. Acceptable forms of ID include one of the following:

- Current and valid photo identification (Ohio driver's license, state ID card, government ID) showing your name and address (current address not required for driver's license or state ID card);
- Military identification showing your name (address not required); or
- A copy of a current utility bill, cell phone bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check, or other government document showing your name and current address.

If you do not provide one of these documents at the polling place, you will still be able to vote a provisional ballot (see below). You will then be expected to provide identification to the Board of Elections within the 10 days following Election Day. If you do not have any of the above forms of identification, including a Social Security number, you will still be able to vote a provisional ballot by signing an affirmation statement swearing to your identity under penalty of election falsification and by casting a provisional ballot.

VOTING MACHINES

If you are not familiar with the type of voting machine used where you vote, the League of Women Voters recommends that you review the process of using the machine before Election Day. Learn more about voting machines used in your county, or check out the League's Ultimate Interactive Ohio Civics Lesson for instructional videos at www.ohioimpact.org.

PROVISIONAL BALLOTS

If your eligibility to vote is in question on Election Day, you can use a provisional ballot to cast your vote. No one should be turned away from a polling place without being given the opportunity to vote by provisional ballot. Once election officials can verify your eligibility, the provisional ballot is counted just like any other ballot.

A provisional ballot may be issued if:

- You recently changed your address or your name and did not update your voter registration.
- Your name does not appear on the official poll list.
- You cannot or do not provide proof of identity (a current, valid photo identification card; military identification; or copy of a utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check, or government document showing your name and current address).
- The poll list or signature book indicates that you requested an absentee ballot.
- The poll list or signature book indicates that mailings have been returned undeliverable.
- Your signature does not match the signature on your registration form.
- Your eligibility to cast a ballot has been challenged by the precinct officers.

If your eligibility is questioned, the League of Women Voters recommends that you cast a provisional ballot rather than leaving the polling place without casting a regular ballot. However, be sure that you are in the correct precinct polling place; if you vote in the wrong one, your vote will not be counted.

HOW CAN I CHECK MY VOTER REGISTRATION STATUS?

Ohio voters can verify current voter registration status by going to the Ohio Secretary of State's website and supplying four items of information: Last Name, Street Name, Zip Code, County. After clicking on the Search button, you should see a list of all registered voters with the specified last name on the specified street. Click on the + sign to the left of a name to expand the listing to show Voter Address, Voter History, Precinct Name, and Polling Location Name and Address. HOW CAN I FIND OUT WHERE TO GO VOTE?

After you register to vote, you should receive a card in the mail from the Board of Elections telling you where your polling location is. You can also call the Board of Elections office in your county or visit the board's website.

If you live in Franklin County, you can also call the League of Women Voters office at (614) 837-1089.

On the day of each general election, the League of Women Voters staffs a Phone Bank at WBNS-10TV to answer voters' questions, including questions about where to vote.

Important Voting Information

How to use the voting machine



1. Adjust the side doors of the booth to give you maximum privacy.

2. Review the instructions on the screen.

Press **VIEW BALLOT** to begin voting.



3. To choose a candidate or issue, firmly touch your selection on the screen.



4. To change your vote, firmly touch your selection again. Then make your new selection.



5. Use the **NEXT** and **BACK** buttons to move between screens.



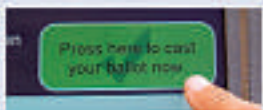
6. On the last page of your ballot, press **REVIEW** to see your voting summary.



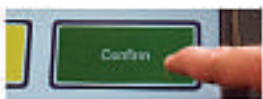
7. From the Review screen you may make changes by touching the contest title on the screen.



WARNING: If the **VOTE** light is flashing, you have not officially cast your ballot.



8. To cast your ballot, firmly touch the green **PRESS HERE TO CAST YOUR BALLOT NOW** button, AND



9. Press the green **CONFIRM** button to confirm your ballot choices.

10. The blue **THANK YOU FOR VOTING** screen means you have properly cast your ballot.

Vote early

Every registered Franklin County voter can enjoy the convenience of voting early this fall - either by mail or in person at the office of the Franklin County Board of Elections located at 280 East Broad Street in downtown Columbus. Beginning Sept. 29 through Nov. 2, hours for in person absentee voting are Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Saturday, October 31 from 8 a.m. until noon.

Applications to vote using a mail-in absentee ballot can be picked up at your local library, downloaded from <http://vote.FranklinCountyOhio.gov> or requested through the Board's automated phone system by calling 462-3100.

Bring identification with you when you vote on Nov. 3

Voters must bring identification to the polls in order to vote a regular ballot on Election Day. Acceptable forms of identification are:

- A current and valid photo identification (such as an Ohio driver license card, state ID card, government ID). Photo identification must show the voter's name and current address (except that an Ohio driver license or State ID card does not need to show current address if the address in the voting location poll book is current; OR
- A military identification that shows the voter's name (does not need to show address); OR
- A copy of a current (within the last 12 months) utility bill (including cell phone bill), bank statement, paycheck, government check, or other government document (including from a public college or university) that shows the voter's name and current address.

Voters who do not provide one of these forms of identification will still be able to vote on Election Day using a provisional ballot.
