Concerned about the economy, the cost of gas, or what is going on in Franklin County? Why depend on ads or "gotcha" reporters' analysis of races for elected offices important to you. Come meet and question candidates yourself, with your written questions asked to all candidates in a particular race by a well-known and well-respected news personality. The Franklin County Consortium for Good Government has just the solution - become an active questioner of candidates, not a passive observer.

The Franklin County Consortium for Good Government, along with many sponsoring and supporting organizations including LWVMC, is sponsoring twelve candidate forums this general election season. They will be moderated by representatives from WBNS 10TV, NBC-4, and WSYX-TV Channel 6. Franklin County, US Congress and judicial candidates, as well as candidates for the Ohio House and Senate, will be invited to attend the forums. The forums feature a half-hour reception before starting - 9:30 AM for the JCC and for the first Northland Community center event. All other forums start with a reception at 6:30 PM and candidate forums starting at 7:00 PM.

"Please put the forums on your must-do list and urge all your friends and relatives to come with you," said LWVMC President **Janyce C. Katz**, who serves as co-chair of the Consortium. "Consider volunteering to help us increase the number of people attending or volunteering at the events."

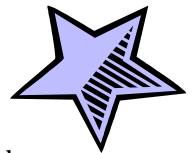

## League's Ukraine Program to Focus on Civil Rule of Law

LWVMC is excited to host a group of six visitors from Ukraine, October 17-25, 2008, through a program sponsored by Open World. This program enables emerging leaders from Eurasia and the Baltic States to experience US democracy and free enterprise in action in communities in the US. Columbus is one of three US cities chosen to host this year.

During their visit, participants will learn about the roles and relationships of the three branches of government at all levels, and how elected officials and civil society organizations in Columbus (which is representative of the entire country) work together to address social issues. They will also examine how the private and non-profit sectors help meet social and civic needs.

Throughout the week, League members in good standing (dues paid for 2008-09) will have opportunities to participate in activities, although attendance will be limited with RSVP required.
